

ORDINANCE NO. 103, SERIES 1994

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SPECIAL  
PRIVATE CLUB LICENSE FOR HARRISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF THE COUNTY OF  
HARRISON, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

1. That it hereby authorizes, pursuant to KRS 243.060 and 243.070, the issuance of a special private club license to any nonprofit social, fraternal, military or political organization or club, which for more than one (1) year prior to the date of application has maintained and operated a club room or rooms from which the general public is excluded, which license shall authorize the licensee to exercise the privilege of a distilled spirits and wine retail drink licensee at the designated premises if the general public is excluded; provided, however, that said licensee may not begin operation hereunder until it shall likewise have received a special private club license from the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

2. That the annual license fee payable to Harrison County for said special private club license shall be \$300.00, payable on a fiscal-year (July 1 - June 30) basis.

3. That this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law

The State Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met in executive session on October 28, 1948, at 3:00 P. M., and amended Regulation LCS-24 (Limit on Retail Liquor Licenses), a copy of which is to be filed with George Glenn Hatcher, Secretary of State. All members being present: Honorable Guy C. Shearer, Chairman, Honorable Thomas J. Hennessy and Honorable Julian G. Elliott, Members. The said Regulation provides as follows:

REGULATION

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board by Section 241.060 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, the following regulation is adopted:

WHEREAS, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board has reviewed the application of Harold Hogg, DBA Walgren Drugs, 19 South Main Street, Cynthiana, Kentucky, and two members of said Board having visited said premises, and

WHEREAS, the Board has carefully considered the application and its field agent's report, and

WHEREAS, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board has had its records of Distilled Spirits Licenses for the County of Harrison checked and rechecked to determine the exact number of said licenses in the County of Harrison that had been issued and renewed, and the Board having carefully considered the number of licenses now outstanding in said county, and after having carefully studied the population, the location and area in which such licensed premises are located;

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the quota for Harrison County, Kentucky, be, and the same is hereby raised from eight (8) to nine (9) Retail Package Liquor

Licenses, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board that a Retail Package Liquor License, be, and the same is hereby ordered to be issued to Harold Hogg, DBA Walgren Drugs, 19 South Main Street, Cynthiana, Kentucky.

Any and all regulations in conflict herewith are rescinded to the extent of such conflict.
