WHEREAS, the City of Lyndon has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to repeal and replace its ordinances relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages to match that of the rest of Metro Louisville,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LYNDON, KENTUCKY, Section 1:

City of Lyndon ordinance 113.01(A), (B), (C), (D), (E), (F) and (G), is hereby repealed and replaced as follows:

113.01 HOURS OF SALE

It shall be unlawful for any licensee under this chapter, or any amendment or supplement thereto:

- (A) To sell, give away, or permit to be sold or given away any distilled spirits or wine at retail between the hours of 12:00 a.m. midnight and 6:00 a.m. on any weekday and Saturday, or between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. Sunday, or the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. Monday.
- (B) To permit the consumption of any distilled spirits or wine on the licensed premises between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any weekday and Saturday or between the hours of 12:00 a.m. Sunday and 6:00 a.m. Monday.
- (C) Notwithstanding subsections (A) and (B), any retail drink or package licensee under this chapter may sell, permit to be sold, and retail drink licensees may permit the consumption of, distilled spirits or wine at any time between 12:00 a.m. on the first Saturday in May of each year through 6:00 a.m. on the following Sunday.

(D) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (A) and (B), any special hours retail package or drink licensee may sell or permit to be sold and any special hours retail drink licensees may permit the consumption of distilled spirits or wine at any time between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. to 4:00 a.m. on each day of the week, as long as the licensee holds a current, corresponding special hours license(s).

#### CITY OF LYNDON, KENTUCKY ORDINANCE #1-20-98; SERIES 1997-98

#### AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR SELLERS AND SERVERS OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE CITY OF LYNDON

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Kentucky Alcohol Beverage Control statues and regulations set out in KRS Chapters 241 to 244 and KAR Chapters 1 to 11, it is the intent of the City of Lyndon to:

- (1) Eliminate the sale of alcoholic beverages to underage persons;
- (2) Reduce intoxication-related accidents, injuries, and deaths;
- (3) Encourage alcoholic beverage retailers to be prudent in their serving practices;
- (4) Encourage alcoholic beverage retailers to implement responsible policies for serving and promoting alcoholic beverages to customers and prevent the over-consumption of alcoholic beverages by customers while on the licensed premises of retailers; and
- (5) Promote an attitude of professionalism and responsibility on the part of retailers who sell or serve alcoholic beverages which is expressed in a commitment to responsible services,

AND, WHEREAS, the requirement of all businesses to participate in a training program for all those who are servers and sellers of alcoholic beverages (certified by the Alcohol Beverage Control Authority) will facilitate these goals,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LYNDON, KENTUCKY:

#### SECTION 1: Creation and Membership

Beginning July 1, 1998, and thereafter, all sellers and retailers of alcoholic beverages, as defined in KRS Chapters 241 to 244 and KAR Chapters 1 to 11, in the City of Lyndon must be certified in the training program established and certified by the local ABC Authority, or one approved through the local ABC authority. It is the responsibility of the above-defined seller or retailer to insure employees who handle the sale and service of alcoholic beverages maintain certification. Newly hired personnel will be given 45 days to obtain their certification. Persons successfully completing the training program will be given a picture identification card. Certification shall be renewed every two (2) years from the date of program completion. Certification for the sellers or retailers shall be as follows:

- (1) Those sellers or retailers holding only a retail beer or package liquor license where no alcoholic beverages will be consumed on the premises must have at least one certified person on the premises at all times to be responsible for all sales of alcoholic beverages.
- (2) Those with any additional liquor sales license must certify each and every person who shall be serving or dispensing alcoholic beverages to the public.

#### Section 2: Responsible Party

Each seller or retailer shall, at the time of applying for its liquor license, designate in writing a Kentucky resident who shall be responsible for compliance with this ordinance.

#### **SECTION 2: COMPLIANCE**

The local ABC Officer, in accordance with his or her duties of enforcement under KRS Statutes and KAR regulation, may take into consideration that the seller or retailer is in full compliance with all requirements hereunder.

#### **SECTION 3: PENALTY**

Any seller or retailer defined above in violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of at least \$100.00, but not more than \$500.00 for each violation. Each day of non-compliance shall be considered a separate offense.

#### **SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE**

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

Section 1. Ordinance # 410.2 (Section VI) Series 1982; Ordinance # 410.3, Series 1982; and Section 31.40 (A) (City of Lyndon Code of Ordinances 1991), concerning the establishment of the city office of Alcoholic Beverage Control Administrator, are hereby repealed.

Section 2. The duties and functions of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Administrator shall hereinafter be included among the duties and functions of the City Citation Officer, whose office was created under Ordinance No# 130.6, Series 1994.

Section 3. If any section, sentence, or clause of this ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

#### CITY OF LYNDON ORDINANCE # 130.6 SERIES 1994

#### AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CITATION OFFICERS

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LYNDON,

- Section 1. There is hereby created a non-elected city office to be known as "Citation Officer".
- Section 2. No person shall be appointed as a Citation Officer unless he or she is:
  - a. At least 21 years of age; and
  - b. Is a high school graduate or has received a General Equivalency Diploma (G.E.D.); and
  - c. Is sober, moral, and sagacious; and
  - d. No person who has been convicted of a felony is eligible for appointment.
- Section 3. Before entering upon his/her duties of office, a Citation Officer shall take the oath as prescribed by Kentucky Constitution, Section 228.
- Section 4. If required by the City Council, a bond in such amount as may be fixed by the City Council, shall be filed with the City Clerk.
- Section 5. The office or position shall be deemed a part time employment, and the compensation shall be not less than \$ 8.00 per hour nor more than \$ 12.00 per hour.
- Section 6. The appointment shall be made by the Mayor and approved by the City Council. The Citation Officer shall file a monthly report with the Mayor and the City Council on the first day of each month reporting on activities for the previous month.
- Section 7. The Citation Officer shall not have the powers of peace officers to make arrests or to carry deadly weapons, but may issue citations, unless otherwise restricted by the City Council, upon observance of:
  - a. Non-moving motor vehicle offenses.
  - b. Violations of ordinances except for moving motor vehicle offenses and except for offenses which constitute a violation of the Kentucky Penal Code.
  - c. Any other duties prescribed by the Mayor and City Council and not contrary to law.
- Section 8. The procedure for citations issued by a Citation Officer shall be as provided in KRS 431.015.
- Section 9. Nothing contained herein shall limit the power of a Citation Officer to make an arrest as a private person as provided in KRS 431.005.
- Section 10. Acting under an Interlocal Cooperation Act Agreement, the City of Lyndon may jointly appoint a Citation Officer with another party to the agreement.

#### GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### \$ 113.01 HOURS OF SALE.

- (A) Distilled Spirits and Wine. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation licensed for the sale of distilled spirits, or wine at retail, to sell, give away, permit to be sold or given away or permit on the licensed premises the consumption of such products between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any week day and Saturday, or between the hours of 2:00 a.m. Sunday and 6:00 a.m. Monday, or on election day when the polls are open in the city.
- (B) Malt Beverages. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation licensed for the sale of malt beverages at retail, to sell, give away, permit to be sold or given away, or permit on the licensed premises the consumption of such products between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any week day and Saturday, or between the hours of 2:00 a.m. Sunday an

1:00 p.m. Sunday, or on any election day when the polls are open in the city.

- (C) The unlawful hours of sale of distilled spirits and wine and the unlawful hours of beer indicated in divisions (A) and (B) above, shall be the hours of 4:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. for the Monday before the first Saturday in May of each year, through 4:00 a.m. of the following Sunday.
- (D) The unlawful hours of sale of distilled spirits and wine and the unlawful hours of beer indicated in divisions (A) and (B) above, shall be the hours of 4:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. for January 1, when it falls on Sunday and Monday respectively, in which case the rules from divisions (A) and (B) of this section apply.
- (E) The sale of distilled spirits or wine at retail may be permitted, on premises licensed for such purposes, between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m. Monday, upon issuance of a special hours license as set forth in § 113.12 of this chapter.
- (F) The sale of malt beverages at retail may be permitted on premises licensed for such purposes between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m. Sunday through 1:00 p.m. Sunday with issuance of a special hours license as set forth in § 113.12 of this chapter. (Ord. 410.2-1984, passed 1-10-84)
- (G) All hotels, motels and restaurants which are retail drink and wine by the drink licensees and who have dining facilities with a minimum seating capacity of 100 people at tables and who receive at least 50% or more of their gross annual income from dining facilities by the sale of food, may sell, permit to be sold or permit consumption of liquor or wine on Sundays between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m. on Monday, the following day.

#### LICENSING

#### § 113.10 LICENSE REQUIRED.

Within the corporate limits of the city, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to do any act authorized by any alcoholic, malt beverage or wine license with respect to the manufacture, storage, sale, purchase, transportation or other traffic in alcoholic beverages unless he holds the kind of license that authorizes such act from the Commonwealth of Kentucky, County of Jefferson, and City of Lyndon. (Ord. 410.2-1982, passed 8-10-82)

#### § 113.11 EXPIRATION OF LICENSE.

All licenses issued shall expire on June 30 of each year.

#### § 113.12 SPECIAL HOURS LICENSE; FEES.

- (A) The City ABC Administrator may issue a special hours license to any person, firm, or corporation holding a license to sell distilled spirits and wine at retail upon payment in advance to the City ABC Administrator of an annual license fee of \$350.
- (B) The City ABC Administrator may issue a special hours license to any person, firm, or corporation holding a license to sell malt beverages at retail upon the payment in advance to the City ABC Administrator of an annual license fee of \$100. (Ord. 410.2-1984, passed 1-10-84)

SERIES - 1982 BEVERAGE CONTROL

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SALE OF DISTILLED SPIRITS, WINE AND MALT BEVERAGES

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF LYNDON, KENTUCKY:

- SECTION I. Within the corporate limits of the City of Lyndon, Kentucky, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to do any act authorized by any alcoholic, malt beverage or wine license with respect to the manufacture, storage, sale, purchase, transportation or other traffic in alcoholic beverages unless he holds the kind of license that authorizes such act from the Commonwealth of Kentucky, County of Jefferson and City of Lyndon.
- SECTION II. That Section II of Ordinance No. 49, Series 1979, of the City of Lyndon, Kentucky, relating to license fees: Distilled Spirits, Wine and Malt be and the same is hereby amended to read in its entirety:

SECTION II. The Following kinds of distilled spirits, malt beverage and wine licenses may be issued by the City of Lyndon Alcoholic Beverage Administrator on the payment of fees as follows:

- Distiller's License, per annum -- \$ 500.00 1. 2.
- Rectifier's License, per annum -- \$3,000.00 3.
- Blender's License, per annum ----\$3,000.00 4. Wholesaler's License, per annum - \$1,500.00
- Retail Distilled Spirits, Package License, per annum -----\$1,200.00
- 6. Retail Distilled Spirits, Drink License, per annum -----\$1,600.00
- 7. Special Temporary Distilled Spirits, per month or part of month - one-sixth (1/6) of fees enumerated in Subsections 5 or 6 -----\$
- 8. Special Private Club, Distilled
- Spirits, per annum -----\$ 75.00 Brewer's License, per annum ----\$ 9.
- 500.00 10. Malt Beverage Distributor's License, per annum -----\$ 400.00
- 11. Malt Beverage Retailer's License:

(a). New Applicant ----\$ 200.00

Renewals -----\$ (b)

(c) Special Temporary License, per month or part of month -----\$

12. Restaurant Wine License (subject to the provisions of KRS 243.032):

(a) Original issue, per annum--\$ 600.00 (b) Annual renewal -----\$ 400.00

Special Sunday Retail Drink 13. license fee. The City Alcoholic Beverage Administrator shall issue a special Sunday retail drink license to any person who holds a license to sell at retail, liquor and wine by the drink and who otherwise qualify for such a license in accordance with the provisions of KRS Chapter 243, as amended, and Section IV hereof, on payment in advance to the City Alcoholic Beverage Administrator of the sum of \$300.00.

SECTION III. All licenses issued shall expire on June 30th of each year.

Section IV. All hotels, matels, and restaurants, which are retail drink and wine by the drink licensees and who have dining facilities with a minimum seating capacity of one hundred (100) people at tables and who receive at least fifty percent (50%) or more of their gross annual income from dining facilities by the sale of food, may sell, permit to be sold or permit consumption of liquor or wine on Sundays between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m. on Monday, the following day.

SECTION V . Any item relating to trafficking in alcoholic beverages that is not covered by this Ordinance shall be governed by the rules and regulations established by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, including all penalties.

SECTION VI. That the City Alcoholic Beverage Control Administrator shall administer all Alcoholic Beverage Control Ordinances and regulations of the City of Lyndon and all statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky relating thereto and the regulations of the Kentucky Alcoholic Beverage Control Board

SECTION VII. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and publication.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING FEES FOR LICENSE OF DISPENSERS OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LYNDON

THE CITY COUNCIL, OF THE CITY OF LYNDON, KENTUCKY, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, it is in the City's interest and general welfare to enact an ordinance relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages within the corporate limits of Lyndon, Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, same is authorized under Kentucky Revised Statute 243.070, 243.030, and 243.040, the City establishes as follows:

Section 1. Every person, firm, organization, or corporation holding a license for the dispensing of alcoholic beverages from the Commonwealth of Kentucky and Jefferson County, Kentucky must obtain a license from the City of Lyndon. This license is in addition to the above mentioned license and shall cover the following categories, in the following amounts:

Beer Retailer, for selling beer at retail for consumption on or off the premises. - \$110.00

Distilled Spirits by the Drink, for consumption on the premises. \$375.00

Distilled Spirits by the Package, for consumption off the premises. To be sold by the package only. - \$750.00

Private Club Liquor Drink, for consumption on the premises only - \$110.00

Restaurant Wine License, by the drink only, for consumption of wine on the premises only. - \$275.00.

Special Temporary Liquor by the Drink, for consumption on the premises only. - \$75.00.

Special Temporary Retail Beer License, for consumption on the premises. -\$15.00

THE CITY COUNCIL, OF THE CITY OF LYNDON, KENTUCKY, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, it is in the City's interest and general welfare to enact an ordinance relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages within the corporate limits of Lyndon, Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, same is authorized under Kentucky Revised Statute 243.070, 243.030, and 243.040, the City establishes as follows:

Section 1. Every person, firm, organization, or corporation holding a license for the dispensing of alcoholic beverages from the Commonwealth of Kentucky and Jefferson County, Kentucky must obtain a license from the City of Lyndon. This license is in addition to the above mentioned license and shall cover the following categories, in the following amounts:

Beer Retailer, for selling beer at retail for consumption on or off the premises. - \$110.00

Distilled Spirits by the Drink, for consumption on the premises. \$375.00

Distilled Spirits by the Package, for consumption off the premises. To be sold by the package only. - \$750.00

Private Club Liquor Drink, for consumption on the premises only - \$110.00

Restaurant Wine License, by the drink only, for consumption of wine on the premises only. - \$275.00.

Special Temporary Liquor by the Drink, for consumption on the premises only. - \$75.00.

Special Temporary Retail Beer License, for consumption on the premises. -\$15.00

Section 2. The person, firm, organization or corporation desiring to sell, distribute or dispense alcoholic beverages must obtain a license in the form prescribed from the City of Lyndon before commencing the sale, distribution or dispensing of alcoholic beverage control.

REC'D. IN LOUISVILLE OFFICE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL DEPT. ON 3-14-79 WD Section 3. The payment shall be made when the licensee receives notice of the amount claimed from the Jefferson County, Kentucky. On receiving said notice, the licensee shall be required to pay to the City of Lyndon, Kentucky, the above mentioned amount. A receipt will be given and the amount paid shall, under the Kentucky Revised Statutes, be deducted from any amount due to Jefferson County, Kentucky.

This ordinance shall become effective for those license purchased for the year beginning July 1, 1979. However, the approval of same is instant with the date below and its effectiveness immediately.

Section 4. Any person, firm, organization or corporation violating any of the terms of this ordinance shall be penalized as provided in the Kentucky Revised Statute.
