The Kentucky Distillers' Association (KDA), in an effort to promote responsible alcohol use by those participating in distillery tours on Kentucky's Bourbon Trail, has developed an initiative to promote a designated driver program with its Members, by providing a small package of spirits to an identified Designated Driver for off-premises consumption following his or her service as a Designated Driver. The essential tenets of the program have been described as follows:

- "Designated Drivers" will self-identify themselves as such upon arrival at the Bourbon Trail Distillery. The Distillery will not permit any self-identified Designated Driver to participate if, in the estimation of the Distillery, the individual is under the age of 21 or appears to be intoxicated or otherwise impaired.
- Designated Drivers will be issued a special ticket, wristband, or other identifier that indicates they will not be served any alcohol by the drink during their visit to the Distillery. Tour guides, servers and bartenders will not serve alcohol by the drink to any Designated Driver.
- In consideration of the Designated Driver's participation and adherence to the rules, and in consideration of the denial by the Distillery of a complimentary sample under KRS 243.0307, a Distillery will offer an Designated Driver an unopened "sample size" package or packages of spirits not to exceed a total of 1.75 ounces at the conclusion of the tour for off-premises consumption.

Because sampling under KRS 243.0307 is an on-premises experience, the cost of the sample package or packages must be included in the tour price for the Designated Driver, which can be discounted, so long as the final cost does not violate the treating statute. The proposed program is consistent with applicable law.
